**Former Hamer Campaign Manager and fellow SNCC member, Charles McLaurin, and MFDP Chairman and Hamer friend, Lawrence Guyot, are part of a National Committee Launching Campaign to Honor Mrs. Fannie Lou Hamer**

Ruleville, MS. Charles McLaurin and Lawrence Guyot are among a distinguished group of scholars, educational leaders, community and civil rights activists who have joined forces to help launch a national fundraising campaign to honor human and civil rights activist Fannie Lou Hamer. **The Fannie Lou Hamer Statue Committee (FLHSC)**, established in summer 2009, exists solely for the purpose of supporting efforts to pay tribute to Mrs. Hamer by commissioning the construction of a full-length statue of the civil and human rights leader, to be placed on permanent display at the Fannie Lou Hamer Memorial Garden in Ruleville, Mississippi. The Board of Alderpersons of the City of Ruleville passed a resolution on April 17, 2008 to lend its support to the project by designating the "tract of property owned and maintained by the City of Ruleville where Mrs. Hamer and her late husband are buried," as the permanent location for the monument.

The FLHSC is a not-for-profit, non-political organization comprised of local, regional and national civil rights activists, scholars and community leaders who serve as fundraising and educational ambassadors in conjunction with the City of Ruleville, and public and private initiatives to help achieve the goals of the FLHSC. The Committee's secondary objective is to further educate the public and future generations about the tremendous sacrifices and achievements made by Mrs. Hamer during her lifetime in an effort to gain freedoms and social justice for African Americans and other disenfranchised groups. Committee members include Dr. Molefi Kete Asante (PA), Dr. Francine C. Childs (OH), Vergie Hamer Faulkner (TN), Lawrence Guyot (DC), Hakim Johnson (DC), Hattie Jordan (MS), Margaret Kibbee (MS), Rev. In addition, a number of renowned national public officials, celebrities and social advocates serve as members of the Honorary Committee, including CRM veteran, the Rev. Willie Blue, William Buckley, former Mayor Shirley Franklin, Davis W. Houck, the Rev. Jesse Jackson Sr., Rep. Eleanor Holmes Norton, Tracy Sugarman, Susan Taylor, Ekwueme Michael Thelwell, Eleanor Walden and Iyanla Vanzant.

The FLHSC is appealing to the public to support this worthy cause. The Committee has set a goal of \$125,000 for the completion of the first phase of the fundraising project and hope to achieve this goal by October 6, 2010, the 93<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of Mrs. Hamer's birth. **The National Black United Fund (NBUF)**, a 501 (c) 3 Black philanthropic organization, has been designated as the fiscal sponsor for the FLHSC.
